

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

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Evidence Based Medicine



- During this times it becomes mandatory to produce verifiable documents providing evidence with respect to pathological Changes in disease and the resulting effects after the treatment is given often referred to as before and after.
- Many disease condition when not treated properly undergo changes of Suppression, identifying this suppressive effects with the help of pathological investigations makes it possible to remove its ill effects.



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Relationship between cause and Pathology



- In homeopathic Prescribing due importance is given to etiology with probable cause, origin, source or a circumstance which may be Physical, Chemical, Mechanical, Biological or dynamic responsible for alteration to the state of health.
- In order to better understand let us assume 3 different patients are suffering from epilepsy. On careful inquiry it is found that one patient has this complaint because of **long period of sleep** whereas second patient is suffering from **after head injury** and third reveals it has started after **an episode of suppress anger**.

CAUSE OF DISEASE

KEY WORDS : Organon of Medicine, Case taking, hidden cause, disease, repertorisation.

In the Organon of Medicine 5th and 6th edition, dynamic causes of disease have been given due importance with respect to occurrence of disease. In clinical practice it is very important to find out the probable cause of disease. So during the Case taking it becomes very important for the physician to search for this from the different sources. The biggest source of information during case taking is the patient himself, but when patients do not develop faith and confidence in the physician they will hide a few details which might be the real **probable cause**. In my 19 years of clinical practice I have encountered a number of cases but during the early years I remember this case very vividly which has made me remember the importance of underlying **hidden cause of disease**.

Mr. XYZ aged 47 came to clinic for complaint of severe burning pain in stomach region since 6 months. His detailed case taking revealed the following important points and a probable cause.

- Burning pain in stomach which aggravates after eating and he feels better when he presses the stomach with his hands or pillow.
- Gets eructation after meals even eating small quantity of food causes multiple eructations.
- Feel that there is some dead weight lying in abdomen after eating.
- Desire for fatty, oily, fried food.
- Perspiration on forehead while eating.
- Perspiration during sleep.
- Metallic taste in mouth.
- Habit of taking tea 7 to 8 times per day.
- Irregular life style, no fix timings for lunch or dinner or sleep.

After a treatment of about 1 and 1/2 months I asked him if he has forgotten to tell me any detail pertaining to his disease, body or life and then he hesitantly told that while **he lost everything in an impulsive moment: he tried to commit suicide by taking Baygon** (Organo-phosphorus compound used as insecticide in households) and even now he sometimes think about doing it again. I was shocked to hear because whenever he used to come for consultations he appeared very composed and strong personality but his attempted suicide revealed that he was wearing a mask all the time, in reality he was not what he appeared. And so I thought of making some changes in totality of symptoms, my later understanding was based on the fact that he consumed irritant poison and that has resulted into the

- Eructation after eating
- Heaviness in abdomen
- < from foods rich in fat and spices
- Perspiration on head while eating
- Perspiration during sleep
- Desire for tea
- Metallic taste in mouth
- Anxiety about business
- **Suicide by poisoning**
