OBJECTIVE:

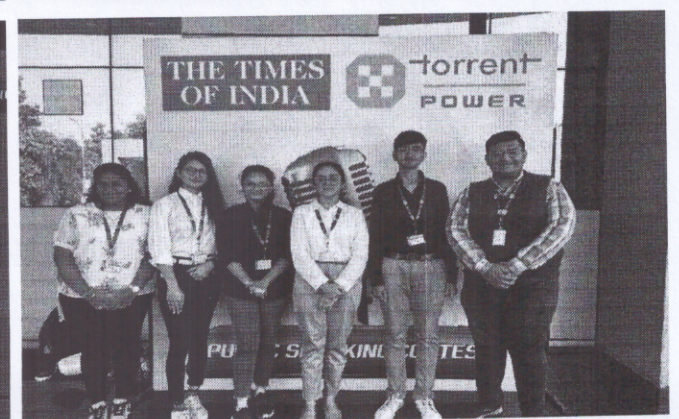
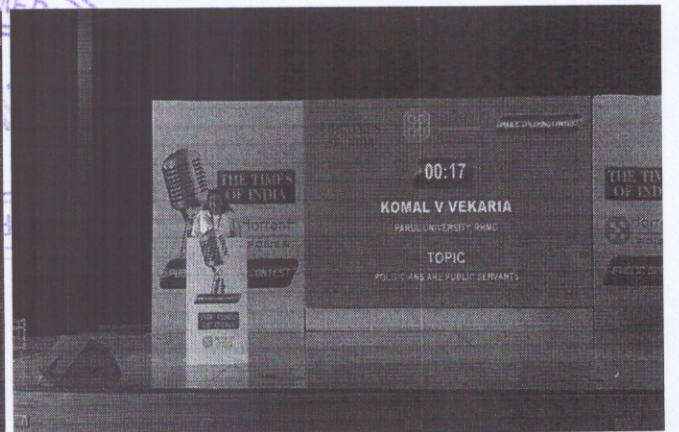
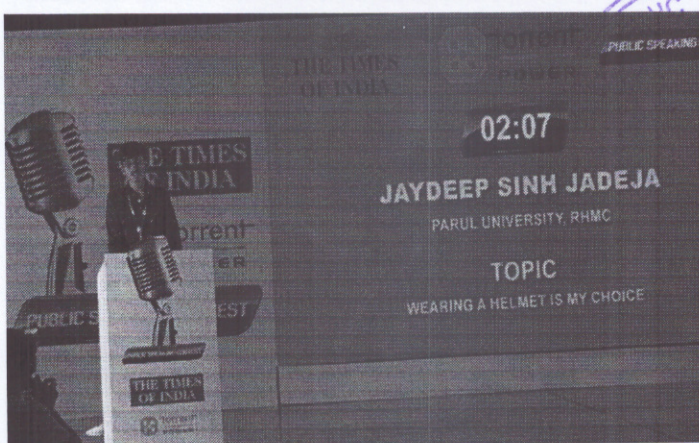
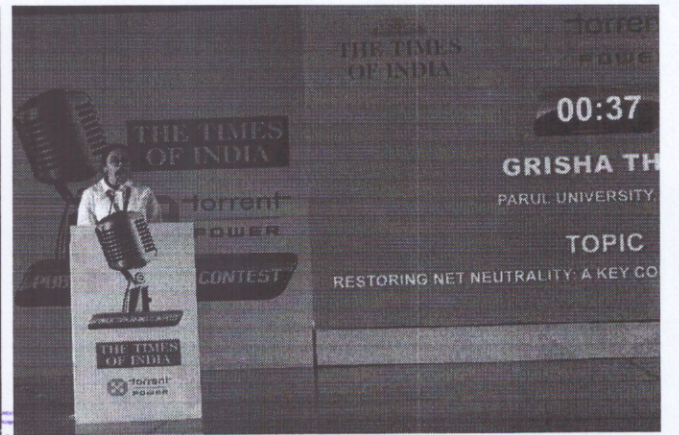
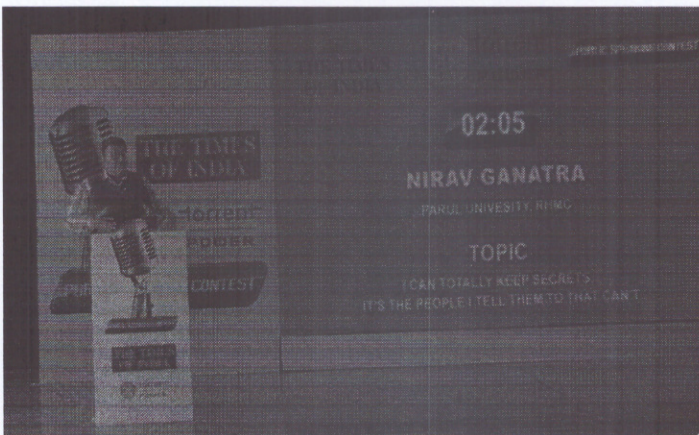

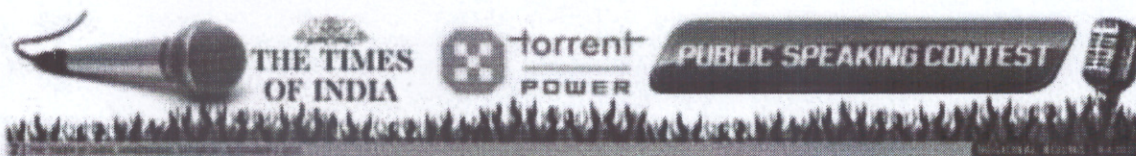
BRIEF DISCUSSION:




CONCLUSION:
