# Inauguration of 'HUNF' – Meals on Wheels Project for senior citizens

#### **Background**

India is home to millions who are malnourished, ranking 104 at the Global Hunger Index.

According to FAO estimates in 'The State of Food Security and Nutrition in the World, 2019' report, 194.4 million people are undernourished in India. By this measure 14.5% of the population is undernourished in India.

Around 73.7% older persons have to take care of the house and other properties of their younger family members to ensure long-term and palliative care in old age," the study report said. "Over 75% of respondents have to limit their personal social interactions as their family members direct them to do so, otherwise their family members can avoid providing their basic



needs of food and medicines." (Source: Livemint). This information indicates a dire need to make provision of basic things required for sustenance of these elderly people, thus doing at least minimum for their Basic Human Rights.

#### 'HUNF' - Meals on wheels Project

'HUNF' is the Gujarati word means to provide mental and physical support to restore dignity to people.

Meals on Wheels is a project that delivers meals to senior citizens at their door step, categorically to those who are bedridden, not able to perform their activities of daily living(ADL), destitute and found unwell. The objective of the project is to provide one-time meal every day to bedridden people at their place of residence in the villages of Waghodiya Block. We made survey in 4 villages namely Ambali, Patiyapura, Limda and Madheli and



around 60 beneficiaries have identified. But in initial stage we have started this project from Madheli village. There are 21 beneficiaries who are bedridden, staying alone.

#### **Process Report**

The Project was inaugurated at 1.00 pm on 1<sup>st</sup> October, 2020, Thursday at PU circle. Dr. Sunita Rakesh Jolly, Dean, Faculty of Social Work and

Principal of Parul Institute of Social work welcomed all dignitories. Mr. Vinod Parmar, Coordinator, Social Responsive Cell briefed about the project. Dr. Geetika Patel, Chairperson
