#### **Policy Overview:**

Parul University recognizes the importance of quality education in fostering sustainable, inclusive, and resilient societies. In line with the G20 priorities on education and development, the National Education Policy (NEP-2020), and the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), this policy promotes lifelong learning, digital inclusivity, and community empowerment. Parul University is committed to preparing individuals for a rapidly changing world and contributing to global progress through equitable access to education.

#### Scope:

This policy applies to all members of the University community, including students, staff, applicants, associate members, alumni, corporate members, visitors, and contractors.

#### Purpose:

The policy aims to:

- Promote Lifelong Learning by ensuring equal access to educational opportunities for all.
- Address Inequality in education related to ethnicity, religion, disability, immigration status, or gender.
- Foster Sustainable Development and Global Citizenship by instilling knowledge of sustainable practices, cultural sensitivity, human rights, and ethical responsibility.
- Bridge Access and Delivery: Provide accessible primary, secondary, and tertiary education
  to individuals from low-income backgrounds, including those from developing countries,
  through scholarships, financial aid, partnerships with online learning platforms, and free
  courses on platforms such as SWAYAM and Coursera.
- Support for Women and Girls: Create safe, inclusive educational spaces that eradicate gender inequality, while offering specialized programs for women and girls to thrive academically and professionally.
- Inclusive Resources for Disabilities and Diverse Identities: Equip students with disabilities, LGBTQ+ individuals, and other marginalized communities with quality learning resources and accessible digital platforms.
- Early Childhood Education: Support primary-level education in underprivileged communities by providing quality education, including programs that reach rural areas through initiatives like the "Library on Wheels" and other outreach activities.
- Technical and Vocational Skill Development: Equip community members with technical and vocational skills, facilitating better employment and entrepreneurship opportunities through hands-on workshops and partnerships with industry leaders.

- Eradicate Illiteracy: Ensure that a substantial number of youth and adults acquire literacy and empowerment through community-based programs, supported by volunteers and local organizations.
- Digital Literacy and Public Access to Learning Resources: Provide digital literacy education for underserved populations, equipping them with essential skills for a digital economy, and ensure free access to university libraries and digital resources via platforms like SWAYAM, YouTube, and University LMS.
- Educator Training and Development: Continuously train and equip educators with standard resources to guarantee high-quality learning experiences. Offer educators free access to specialized training and certifications in online teaching methods and digital literacy.
- Sustainable and Ethical Citizenship: Raise socially responsible individuals by promoting knowledge of sustainable practices, global citizenship, human rights, and gender equality through dedicated community outreach and education programs.
- Expand Community Access Facilities: Increase facilities for individuals from diverse backgrounds, ensuring all spaces are non-discriminative and supportive of educational inclusion, with a focus on providing disability-friendly resources and technology.

#### Responsibilities

- School and Community Programs: Facilitate outreach in local schools and communities with engaging lectures, skill-building workshops, and interactive events led by students and faculty, focusing on empowerment and knowledge sharing.
- Student-Run Initiatives: Inspire student-led volunteer programs that support underserved communities, celebrating global milestones like World Education Day to foster awareness and positive community impact.
- Partnerships for Outreach: Collaborate with local and international NGOs and government initiatives to maximize outreach and impact.
- Open Access to Libraries and Digital Resources: Offer free, unrestricted access to university libraries and digital resources for all, extending memberships to alumni, corporate partners, and the general public.
- Digital Learning Platforms: Provide public access to educational resources through SWAYAM, YouTube, Coursera, and University LMS, making high-quality learning content accessible worldwide.
- Community Skill Development Workshops: Host hands-on vocational training sessions aimed at enhancing employability and entrepreneurship for non-traditional and unemployed individuals, aligning with G20 goals for workforce inclusivity.
- Executive Education and Public Courses: Organize open programs that equip community members with essential, real-world skills, fostering economic participation and social mobility.
- Access to Labs and Research Facilities: Enable the public to engage with university labs and research facilities for practical, hands-on learning, fostering innovation and local development.

- Annual Exhibitions: Hold exhibitions showcasing student and faculty innovations, inviting the broader community to engage with and benefit from academic research and projects.
- Accessible Learning Resources: Develop high-quality, adaptive learning materials and assistive technologies to support learners with disabilities, ensuring equitable access for all.
- Diverse Support Programs: Provide tailored learning resources and safe spaces that support non-traditional and marginalized learners, enhancing educational inclusivity.
- Outcome and Impact Tracking: Implement robust data systems to monitor and assess the effectiveness of lifelong learning programs, ensuring accountability and alignment with G20 goals.
- Policy Review and Adaptation: Annually review and update the policy to align with evolving educational needs, NEP-2020, and G20 priorities, communicating updates through university channels for transparency.
- Sustainability and Global Citizenship Programs: Integrate modules on sustainability, ethics, and global citizenship into community programs, preparing individuals for responsible, environmentally conscious careers.
- Public Awareness Campaigns: Conduct campaigns addressing climate change, gender equality, and human rights, fostering a culture of social responsibility and global awareness.
- Community-Led Programs: Expand learning access through initiatives like "Library on Wheels" for rural communities, and organize programs on significant days (e.g., World Literacy Day) to promote lifelong learning.
- Public Resource Accessibility: Offer library memberships and access to educational resources to alumni, corporate members, and non-enrolled individuals, furthering knowledge dissemination.

#### **Metrics and Evaluation**

#### Annual Performance Indicators:

- Track participation in outreach programs, public events, and online courses.
- Monitor the impact of skill-development programs on employment rates and job placements.
- Measure library and digital resource usage by non-enrolled and community members.
- Survey feedback on satisfaction with outreach programs and courses provided.

## Annual Reporting and Feedback:

 Provide an annual report on lifelong learning activities, metrics achieved, and community engagement levels. Collect feedback from community members, students, alumni, and corporate partners to continuously enhance the policy's impact.

#### Review:

The policy will be reviewed annually and updated according to the university's requirements. Amendments will be communicated to university members through the website and other relevant channels.
